Musical recording formats

Compact discs (including MP3-CDs)

Vinyl records



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RDA core elements

- Title
- Statement of responsibility, such as composer, performer, etc.
- Edition information, when present
- Publication information such as name of publisher, place of publication, and date
- Physical description
- Series statement, when present
- Identifier(s), such as ISBN, UPC, publisher's number, etc.

Preferred source of information

- Disc label
- If there is no title on the preferred source, check (in order of precedence):
 - The container or accompanying material
 - Other source such as a website or vendor catalog, etc.
- Last resort: Cataloger devises a title

General material designation (GMD)

Not used in RDA—removed from records in OCLC

- SHARE local practice: add GMD to all audio recording records in Polaris
- Subfield h comes after subfields a, n, and p
- Subfield h comes before subfield b

245 \$aTitle proper\$h[sound recording]

Example—GMD

OCLC record:

245 00 \$aDown the old plank road :\$bthe Nashville

sessions

SHARE local edit:

245 10 \$aDown the old plank road\$h[sound recording] :
\$bthe Nashville sessions

Statement of responsibility—245 \$c

Includes:

- Composer
- Performer on the preferred source
 - In OCLC, will be entered in 7XX, not 1XX (unless also the composer)
- Does not include:
 - Performer(s) not listed on preferred source
 - Producers
 - Directors

Example—Statement of Responsibility

OCLC record: 245 00 \$aTake the weather with you

/\$cJimmy Buffett.

SHARE local edit:

245 10 \$aTake the weather with you

\$h[sound recording] /\$cJimmy Buffett.

Edition statement

- Source is anywhere on the item
 - Same source as title proper is preferred, but can come from another place on the item
 - If taken from outside the resource (i.e, website), put in brackets
- Transcribe exactly from the source, including capitalization and abbreviations

On item: EX-panded and RE-mastered edition

In record: 250 _ _ _ \$aEX-panded and RE-mastered edition.

Edition statement—SHARE cataloging

- Original or copy cataloging in OCLC
 - □ Single or multiple 250s are acceptable
- SHARE local practice:
 - Add an edition statement to records for MP3 audio recordings and vinyl albums to distinguish format
 - Record in brackets
 - Combine multiple edition statements in single 250

250 _ _ \$aDeluxe Edition, [Vinyl LP].

Publication Information

Includes

- Place of production, publication, distribution, manufacture (\$a)
- Producer, publisher, distributor, manufacturer (\$b)
- Dates (\$c)

Source of information

Anywhere on the item

ISBD punctuation

- Semi-colon before place of publication if multiple
- Colon before publisher name
- Comma before date
- 264_0, 264_1, 264_2, or 264_3: Period at end of field, if date is not in brackets
- 264 _4: No ending punctuation

Publication, distribution, etc.

- May have multiple 264s for different functions denoted by 2nd indicator
- **264 _0 \$aPlace** of production :**\$bProducer**,**\$cProduction** date.
- **264 _1 \$a**Place of publication :**\$b**Publisher,**\$c**Publication date.
- **264 _2 \$a**Place of distribution :**\$b**Distributor,**\$c**Distribution date.
- **264 _3 \$a**Place of manufacture :**\$b**Manufacturer,**\$c**Date of manufacture.
- 264 _4 \$cCopyright date

Publisher

- May use any source on the item or within the item
 - Preferred source is the same source as title proper
- Transcribe name of publisher as it appears on the item
 - Example: Harper Audio, part of the Harper Group
- If multiple publishers, record first publisher
 - Optional to record others
- If no publisher, enter probable name in brackets or the phrase "[publisher not identified]"

Distributor

- If no publisher on the item, distributor is core, if present
 - If publisher is present, do not record distributor
- May use any source on the item or within the item
 - Preferred source is the same source as title proper
- Transcribe name of distributor as it appears on the item
 - Example: Universal Music & Video Distribution, Inc.

Dates

- Publication date core element use the most recent publication date
 - Audio recordings usually don't have a publication date
- Copyright date core element if no publication date
 - Copyright date for sound is denoted by phonogram symbol (®)
 - Record as implied publication date, in brackets
 - If no phonogram date is present, but there is a copyright date with © symbol
 - Record as implied publication date, in brackets

Beware...

Earliest dates of LPs and CDs

- An implied publication date can't be earlier than the date a format was first available:
 - □ LPs: 1948
 - □ Audio compact discs: 1982
 - □ MP3-CDs: 2000

No date available on item

Cataloger estimates a date (preferred) or enters the phrase "[date of publication not identified]"

Examples: [2010]—inferred or probable year
[2010?]—uncertain year
[between 1990 and 1999]—probable
decade

SHARE local practice: record an estimated date in brackets

Phonogram date

Physical Characteristics—3XX

Includes

- Physical description (300)
- Content type (336)
- Media type (337)
- Carrier type (338)
- Sound characteristics (344)
- Digital file characteristics (347)

Source of information

Entire item

Extent—300 \$a

- Record the number of physical units
 - Use the term audio disc(s)
- Record playing time in parentheses, if readily available
 - Abbreviate hour(s) as hr.
 - Abbreviate minute(s) as min.
 - Abbreviate second(s) as sec.
 - Spell out approximately, even if abbreviated on item

Example: **300** _ _ **\$a**1 audio disc (1 hr., 20 min.)

Other physical details—300 \$b

- Previously used to record sound characteristics (i.e., analog, digital, stereo, etc.)
- May still be present in records
 - OK to retain
- Preferred option is to omit \$b in the 300 and record sound characteristics in MARC tag 344

Dimensions—300 \$c

- Give diameter of discs in inches
 - □ Standard size of CDs is 4 ¾ inches
 - Standard size of LPs is 12 inches
 - Abbreviate inches as in.

Accompanying Material—300 \$e

- Give details as you would describe the item in an individual record
 - □ 300 _ _ \$a4 audio discs;\$c12 in. +\$e1 program guide (40 pages : illustrations ; 24 cm)

Example—MARC tag 300

CDs:

300 \$a1 audio disc ;**\$c**4 ³/₄ in.



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LPs:

300 \$a1 audio disc (42 min., 19 sec.) ;**\$c**12 in.

- 336 Content type
- 336 _ _\$aperformed music\$bprm\$2rdacontent
- 337 Media type
- 337 ___\$aaudio\$bs\$2rdamedia
- 338 Carrier type
- 338 _ _\$aaudio disc\$bsd\$2rdacarrier
- Use macro to generate in OCLC

MARC tags 34X

340	Physical medium
344	Sound characteristics
347	Digital file characteristics

Recording 34X fields—general guidelines

- Record each term in a separate 34X field (per OCLC)
- Controlled vocabulary terms now come from lists on the RDA Registry website, rather than RDA Toolkit
 - Links to lists can be found in Bibliographic Formats and Standards (BFAS) entry for the field and subfield
 - Enter the code for the list in \$2
- Not every term is included in an RDA Registry list
 - If using a term not on a controlled list, omit \$2

Physical medium—340

Use to record physical description

```
For LPs, include:340 _ _ $avinyl$2rdamat
```

Sound characteristics—344

- Use to record type of recording, recording medium, playing speed, configuration of playback channels, special playback characteristics, etc.
- Record as applicable
- **344** _ _ **\$a**digital**\$2**rdatr *or*
- **344** _ _ **\$a**analog**\$2**rdatr
- Include \$g as applicable for mono, stereo, surround, etc.
- 344 _ _ \$gmono\$2rdacpc
- For LPs, include \$c with playing speed
- **344** _ _ **\$c**33 1/3 rpm

Digital file characteristics—347

 Use to record file type, encoding format, file size, etc. for digital formats

For CDs:
347 _ _ $aaudio file$2rdaft
347 _ _ $bCD audio
For MP3s:
347 _ _ $aaudio file$2rdaft
347 _ _ $bMP3
```

Do not use this field in records for LPs. Vinyl records are not digital

MARC tags 38X

Characteristics of a work or expression. May be used to differentiate a work from another work with the same title.

380	Form of work
382	Medium of performance
383	Numeric designation of musical work
384	Key

Optional to add; don't delete if present.

Form of work—380

- Use to record a class or genre to which a work belongs if not adequately described by the title or through genre or subject terms
- Don't delete if present; optional to add
 - If you add, use lcgft term if available

Example:

380 __ \$aConcertos\$2lcgft

Medium of performance—382

- Use to record instrumental, vocal and/or other medium of performance
- Don't delete if present; optional to add
 - If you add, follow guidance in MLA's <u>Best Practices</u> for Using LCMPT

Example:

382 01 \$bcello\$aorchestra

A work for solo cello accompanied by an orchestra Notice order of subfields

Numeric Designation of Musical Work —383

- Serial number, opus number, or thematic index number assigned to a musical work by the publisher, composer, or musicologist
- Don't delete if present; optional to add

Example:

383 _ _ \$cRV423

Thematic index number for Concerto in B-flat major for cello, strings & basso continuo, by Antonio Vivaldi

Key-384

- The pitch name and the mode
- Don't delete if present; optional to add

Example:

384 _ _ **\$c**D major

Additional information about the resource

Source of information

The item itself, or other sources

MARC coding

Some note fields use indicators—see OCLC
 Bibliographic Formats and Standards (BFAS)

ISBD punctuation

Most notes have ending punctuation; a few do not—See OCLC BFAS

Some common note fields

588 Source of description

- Always include for source of title, even if title is from the preferred source
- Change 500 to 588 when editing

505 Contents note

- Titles of works
- See SHARE local practice

508 Creation/production credits note

Name(s) of directors, producers, etc.

511 Participant or performer note

- Performers
 - Include main performer(s); others may be recorded individually or with general statement (i.e., accompanying musicians)
 - May list individual members of groups if desired
 - Separate functions with space; space

Some common note fields--cont.

- 518 Date/Time and Place of an Event Note
 - Use to record the date/time and/or place of broadcast, recording, mixing, mastering, etc.
 - Info may be recorded in subfield a or in multiple subfields

Examples:

518 _ _ **\$a**Recorded at Sun Studios, Memphis, Tennessee, March 2014. *or*

518 _ _ **\$o**Recorded**\$p**Sun Studios, Memphis, Tennessee**\$d**March 2014.

Some common note fields--cont.

- 520 Summary, etc.
 - Brief description of contents of work if applicable

Example:

520 _ _ **\$a**A collection of songs to promote relaxation and stress relief.

- 538 System requirements
 - Add as appropriate for MP3s
- 546 Language note
 - Add if other than English, or for multiple languages

Example:

546 _ _ \$aSung in French and Italian.

Note: If 546 is present, also include MARC tag 041

Quoted notes—500

- Direct quote from item
- If taken from preferred source, end with period inside closing quotation mark

Example

500 _ _ **\$a**"The highest-class bluegrass in the world."

If taken from elsewhere on item, give the source, end with a period

Example

500 _ _ **\$a**"Timeless holiday classics woven in the Celtic tradition"—Container.

Examples of contents notes—505

This is not an exhaustive list!—see more examples in OCLC Bibliographic Formats and Standards

One performer:

505 00 \$tHey good lookin' --\$tBoats to build --\$tLicense to chill.

Multiple performers:

505 00 \$tHappy**\$r**(Pharrell Williams) --**\$t**Dark horse**\$r**(Katy Perry featuring Juicy J) --**\$t**The man**\$r**(Aloe Blacc).

Composers

505 00 \$tYou've got a friend /\$rCarole King --\$tMagic moments /\$rBurt Bacharach --\$tIf I had a hammer /\$rPete Seeger.

Composers and performers; time of individual songs

505 00 \$tYou've got a friend /\$rCarole King (Cher)\$g(4:25) --\$t Magic moments /\$rBurt Bacharach (Perry Como)\$g(3:15) -- \$tIf I had a hammer /\$rPete Seeger (Bruce Springsteen)\$g(3:45).

Subject headings—add as appropriate

- Topical
 - Medium of performance
 - Code as subject heading, not as genre
- Example: 650 _0 \$aPiano music.
- Type of music with chronological subdivision
 - Check authority file for valid chronological subdivisions for the heading
- **Example: 650 _0** \$aRock music\$y2001-2010.
- If entire audio recording is on one subject:
 - Topical or geographic heading with subdivision \$v Songs and music

Example: 651 _0 \$alllinois\$vSongs and music.

Subject headings—cont.

- Genre
 - Add as applicable for genre of music
 - Do not add subdivisions to genre headings

Examples:

- 655 _7 \$aRock music.\$2lcgft
- 655 _7 \$aConcertos.\$2lcgft
- 655 _7 \$aFilm soundtracks.\$2lcgft
- SHARE local practice: add in records for MP3s
 655 0 \$aMP3 (Audio coding standard)

Standard numbers

- 020-International Standard Book Number (ISBN)
 - Not often found on musical audio recordings
- 024-UPC number

028-Publisher's number

050, 090, 082, 092 Call numbers

Other common 0XX fields

- 041-Language code
 - Coded form of language(s) recorded in 546 for multilingual items or translations
 - Subfield d for language code of sung or spoken text
 - Subfield e for language code of libretto
 - Subfield g for language code of accompanying material other than libretto
 - Subfield h for language code of original
- 043-Geographic area code
 - Code for places recorded in subject headings
 - Use OCLC macro to add
- 047-Form of musical composition code
 - Codes that identify the types of composition

MARC tag 007

- Physical description fixed field
 - Used in records for non-print formats
 - Polaris uses to generate format icon in PAC

- \$a s sound recording\$b d sound disc\$d b 32.1/2 rpm
- **\$d** b 33 1/3 rpm
- **\$e** s stereo, OR m for mono OR q for quadraphonic OR u for unknown
- **\$f** m microgroove/fine
- **\$g** e 12 in.
- \$h n not applicable
- \$i n not applicable
- **\$m** u u unknown, or applicable code if information is available on the item
- **\$n** e analog electrical storage

Fixed field elements

- Will always be present in the record, but may or may not contain data
- Will only accept data that is valid for that field
- Different formats of material have different fixed field elements
- Data can be used to limit searches
- Some are system-supplied; some are coded from data in the variable fields
- Polaris uses to generate format icon in the PAC

Unique fixed field elements for audio recordings

- Type (Type of Record): j for musical audio recordings
- Comp (Form of Composition): code as applicable for type of music
 - If more than one type applies, code as mu and add tag 047 for individual codes

Example:

Audio recording includes concertos, sonatas, overtures, and fugues

Comp fixed field element: mu

Add:

047 _ _ \$aco\$asn\$aov\$afg

Unique fixed field elements for audio recordings (cont.)

- AccM (Accompanying Matter): code as applicable for accompanying material
- Part (Music parts): n for musical audio recordings
- TrAr (Transposition and Arrangement): n for musical audio recordings
- FMus (Format of Music): n for musical audio recordings
- LTxt (Literary Text for Sound Recordings): blank for musical audio recordings
- Other fixed field elements are the same for all formats code as applicable

Authorized access points for music audio recordings--names

- Creator—MARC tag 1XX
 - Composer
- Contributors—MARC tag 7XX
 - Performers
 - Conductors
 - Producers
 - Musical groups
 - Orchestra
 - Choir
 - Group
 - Etc.

1XX vs 7XX for performers— SHARE local practice

- In records for music other than classical, if the principal performer in the statement of responsibility is recorded in a 7XX field, change to the appropriate 1XX field, unless all works are by one composer
 - This is a local edit only; do not make this change in the OCLC record

Example—SHARE local practice

OCLC record:

245 00 \$aMagical mystery tour /\$cThe Beatles.

710 2_ \$aBeatles,\$eperformer.

SHARE local edit:

110 2_ \$aBeatles,\$eperformer.

245 10 \$aMagical mystery tour\$h[sound recording] /\$cThe Beatles.

Note: Remember to change the 245 1st indicator to 1.

Authorized access points for names—relationship designators

Include a relationship designator in every 1XX and 7XX field

- In OCLC, will be recorded in \$4 with 3-letter relator code or in \$e with a relationship designator
- SHARE local practice:
 - Add \$e if not already present
 - Change \$4 to \$e with relationship designator
 - Use terms from Appendix I or K in RDA Toolkit, or from MARC code list for relators

Uniform titles

 If established, add a uniform title for works contained on the recording

Especially for classical music, titles on the item may be very different than the uniform title

Uniform titles--Example

Item being cataloged: Recording of works by Antonio Vivaldi

505 Contents note from container:

505 00 \$tStorm at sea --\$tThe night --\$tThe four seasons.

Uniform title added entries:

700 1_ \$iContainer of (work):**\$a**Vivaldi, Antonio,**‡d**1678-1741.**‡t**Concertos,**‡m**flute, oboe, violin, bassoon, string orchestra,**‡n**RV 570,**‡r**F major.

700 1_ \$iContainer of (work):**\$a**Vivaldi, Antonio,**‡d**1678-1741.**‡tCimento de**ll'armonia e dell'inventione.**‡n**N. 1-4.

Polaris format icons

Created from coding in the LDR, 006, 007 and/or 008, depending on format

Check to be sure your record reflects the correct format icon


