


Katy

EDIA vs DEIA

 "Placing equity before diversity and inclusion focuses on the belief that without equity, efforts to promote diversity and inclusion are laudable, but not sustainable. To enact equity is to provide all people with fair opportunities to attain their full potential."

EDIA Work Can be Intimidating!

- Common fears/worries when approaching EDIA work or subjects:
- Not sure where to begin.
- Not familiar with some of the vocabulary and terms keep changing.
- Afraid to say the "wrong" thing.
- Feel your voice doesn't matter.

Values of EDIA Work and Cataloging


- Equity work in libraries promotes fairness in relations between individuals in society and equal access to wealth, opportunities, and social privilege.
- When doing the work of EDIA, we recognize that there are equity, diversity, inclusion, and accessibility issues and obstacles.
- Addressing the bias in LCSH, including the politically driven vs. people driven or natural language concepts that could be utilized in LCSH terminology.



Values of EDIA and Cataloging, cont.

- Inconsistency in creation of terminology due to lack of information, etc.
- LCSH is white-centric and Christian centric.
- LCSH often uses problematic language.
- "Neutrality" & objectivity is a myth.

What can you do at your library?

- Create local headings or find local headings from other thesauri to replace problematic LCSH.
- Run a collection diversity audit.
- Talk with your vendor about local authority record updates via a profile.
- Create an in-house EDIA discussion group to talk about cataloging work issues.
- Create local authority records.



What can you do at your library? Cont.

- Create an in-house EDIA group focused on education.
- Review classification systems you use (Dewey, LC)
- Think like a user: use more natural language in your catalog.
- Work to update bibliographic records & item labels when an author/creator's name changes.

Our work in EDIA Cataloging at IHLS: Ethics in Cataloging Group

- An in-house group at IHLS of SHARE and CMC catalogers.
- A monthly discussion group.
- An article, documentary, etc., will be proposed and catalogers come together to discuss it afterwards.
