

Information Access & Use Question

How do employees utilize critical thinking, creativity, and innovation to make decisions or solve problems in your industry?

Summary of Answer by Col. Glenn Collins, 923nd Airlift Wing

Three D's of decision making:

- Discipline Decisions Maker (take the time to do the research to know the problem issue yourself and know the policy that will help you answer that)
- Be Decisive in decision making (the right time, not quickly, at the right time with the right information)
- Be a Diplomatic Decision Maker (have a little bit of empathy; put yourself in their shoes)

SAMPLING OF ANSWERS

Communication & Collaboration Question

What interpersonal communication qualities are most desired in your industry? How are those skills utilized on a daily basis?

Summary of Answer by Diane Tyre, Gulfstream

We build multimillion dollar airplanes. People trust that we know what we are doing. Employees need to be self-assured and have enough self-confidence to speak out when things are not going correctly. Teach confident in problem-solving. Employees must be able to speak up when they do not understand or when something is not going correctly.

Information Access & Use Question

Is artificial intelligence (AI) affecting your business field and/or employees?

Summary of Answer by Jeff Mishkin, Korte & Luitjohan Contractors, Inc.

Tools change over time. Fundamentals stay the same. You hire for attitude and train for skills. Soft skills will separate students. Prepare them for collaboration, team exercise, and communication.
