Potential Benefits for Libraries



Long-term cost savings for SHARE member libraries.



Faster delivery turnaround time after weekends and holidays.



More accurate sorting.



Pandemic-resistant sorting.



More accurate data tracking and statistics.



Potential for sorting holds and returns for SHARE member libraries.



Potential Benefits to IHLS



Reduced long-term operating costs



Faster delivery turnaround time after weekends and holidays.



Increased efficiency through increased speed.



Reduced likelihood of chronic injury

Fees?

IHLS Members do not pay fees.

(SHARE is fee-based, IHLS is not.)

No portion will be passed along to libraries by IHLS or SHARE.



How much will it cost member libraries?

Fees?

IHLS Members do not pay fees.
 (SHARE is fee-based, IHLS is not.)
 No portion will be passed along to libraries by IHLS or SHARE.

Other costs?

- Only possible costs: re-barcoding some items
 - ► If (and only if) libraries
 - Are SHARE members
 - and have item barcodes on the inside
 - and don't have an RFID tag
 - and those items are circulated outside of your library



How will IHLS pay for it?

Potential funding sources

- General Fund Reserve Balance
- Grants



How long will it take to see a return on investment?

RO

Will be calculated by IHLS Finance and Operations staff after RFP

- Current estimate is ~7 years
- Machines typically last 10-15 years

More research on member needs, machine capabilities

• Decision re: issuing an RFP

RFP (writing, issuing, collecting responses, analysis)

Stage 3

Decision re: purchasing a machine



Where are we in the process?

Stage 3

- RFP (writing, issuing, collecting responses, analysis)
- Decision re: purchasing a machine

October 2023	Work with consultant to write RFP
January 2024	RFP posted
January 2024	Additional re-barcoding analysis conducted
April 2024	RFP results reviewed IHLS Return on Investment (ROI) analysis completed
May 2024	IHLS Board decision of AMHS plans
