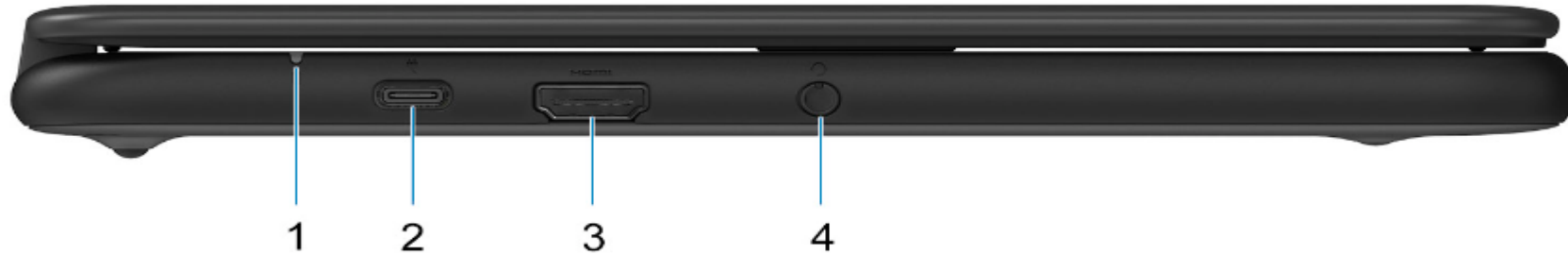

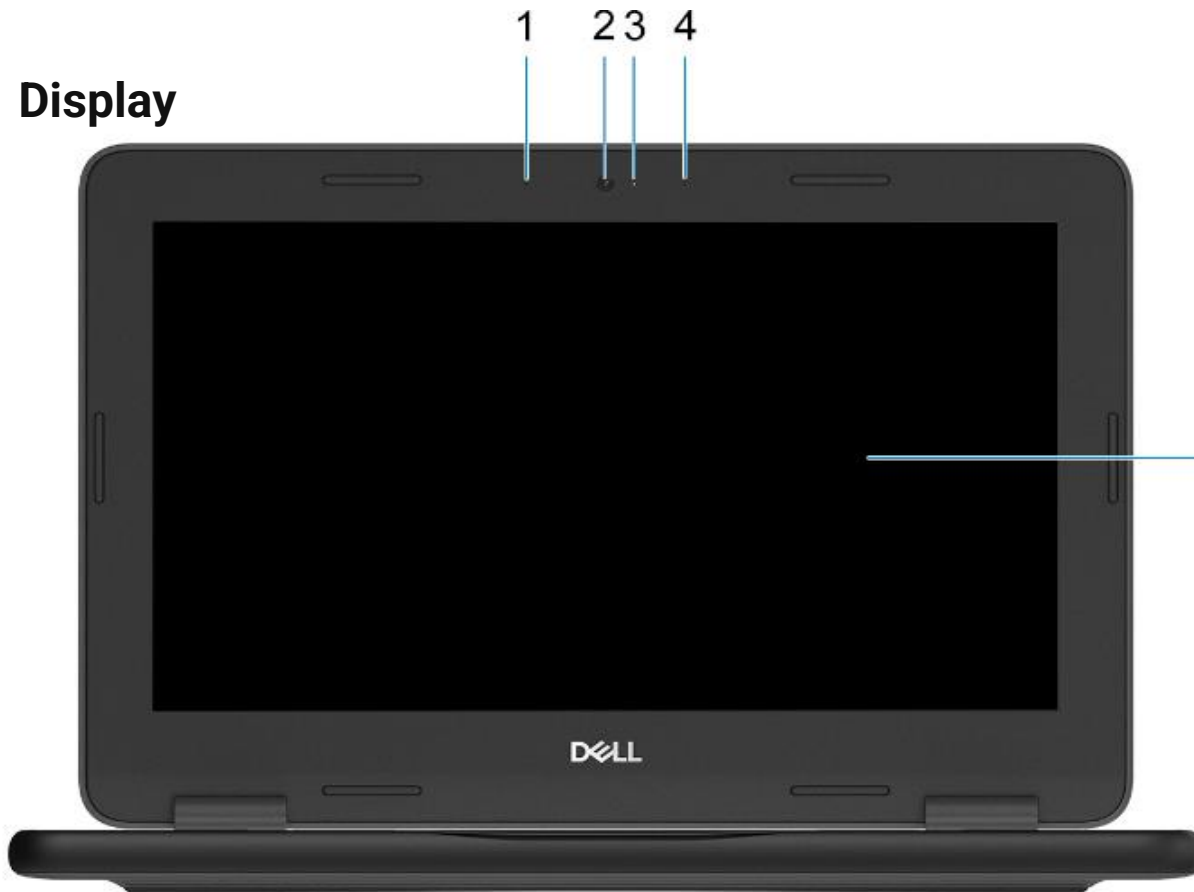

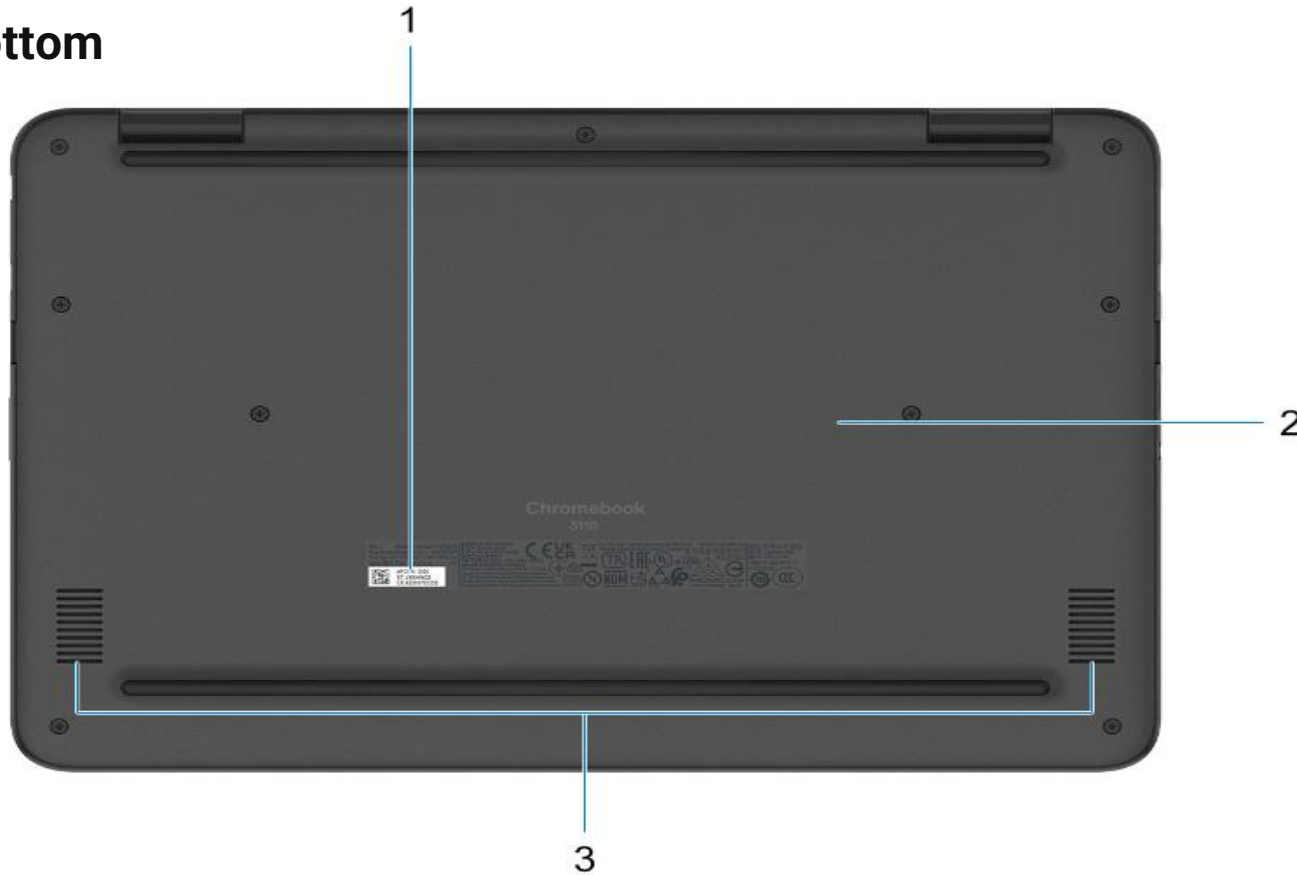

- The service tag is a **unique alphanumeric identifier** that allows Dell service technicians to identify the hardware components in your computer and **access warranty information.**

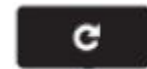

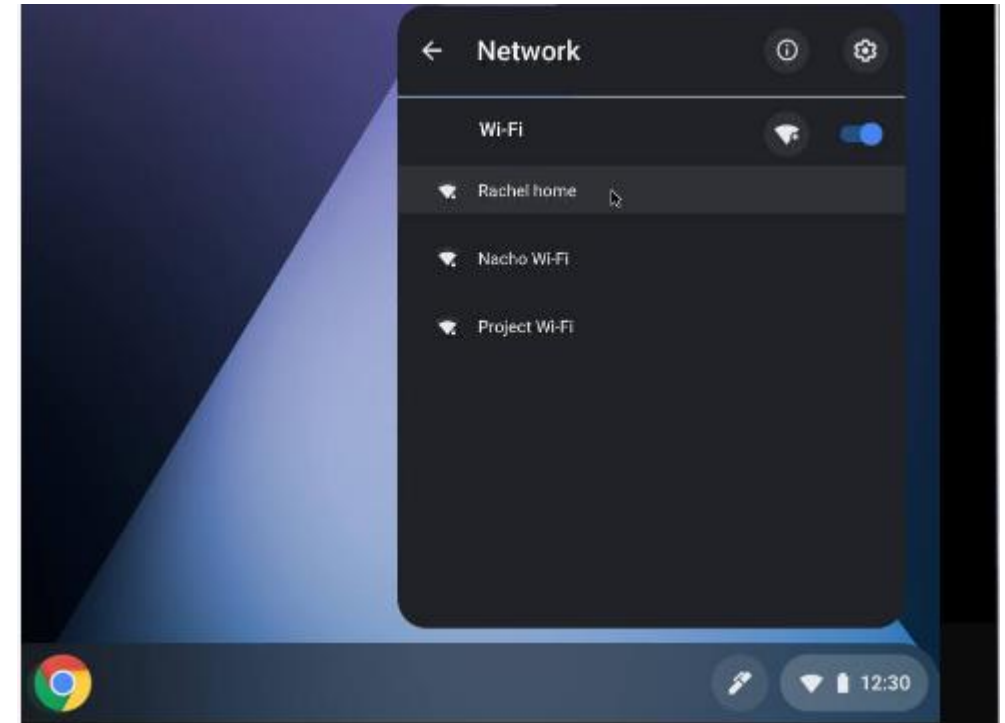
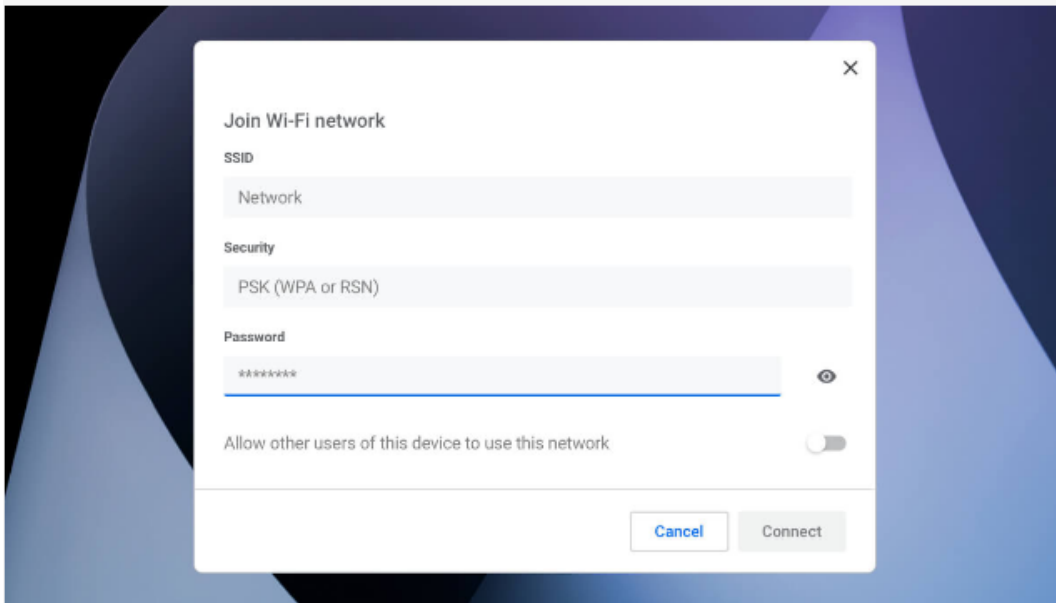
How to Connect to Wi-Fi

- **Step 2:** Click on “no-network.”



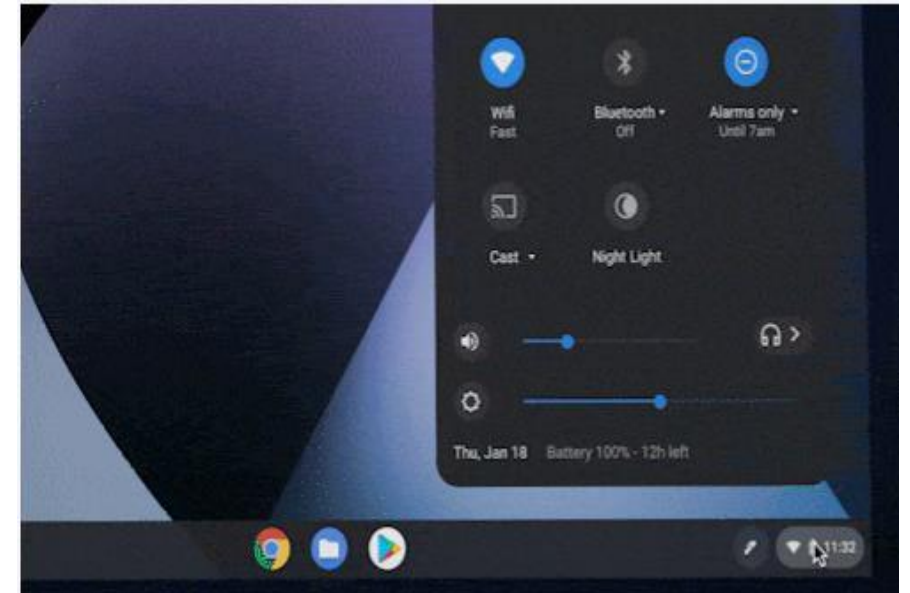
How to Connect to Wi-Fi (Continue)

- **Step 4:** Pick one and enter the password if it calls for one.



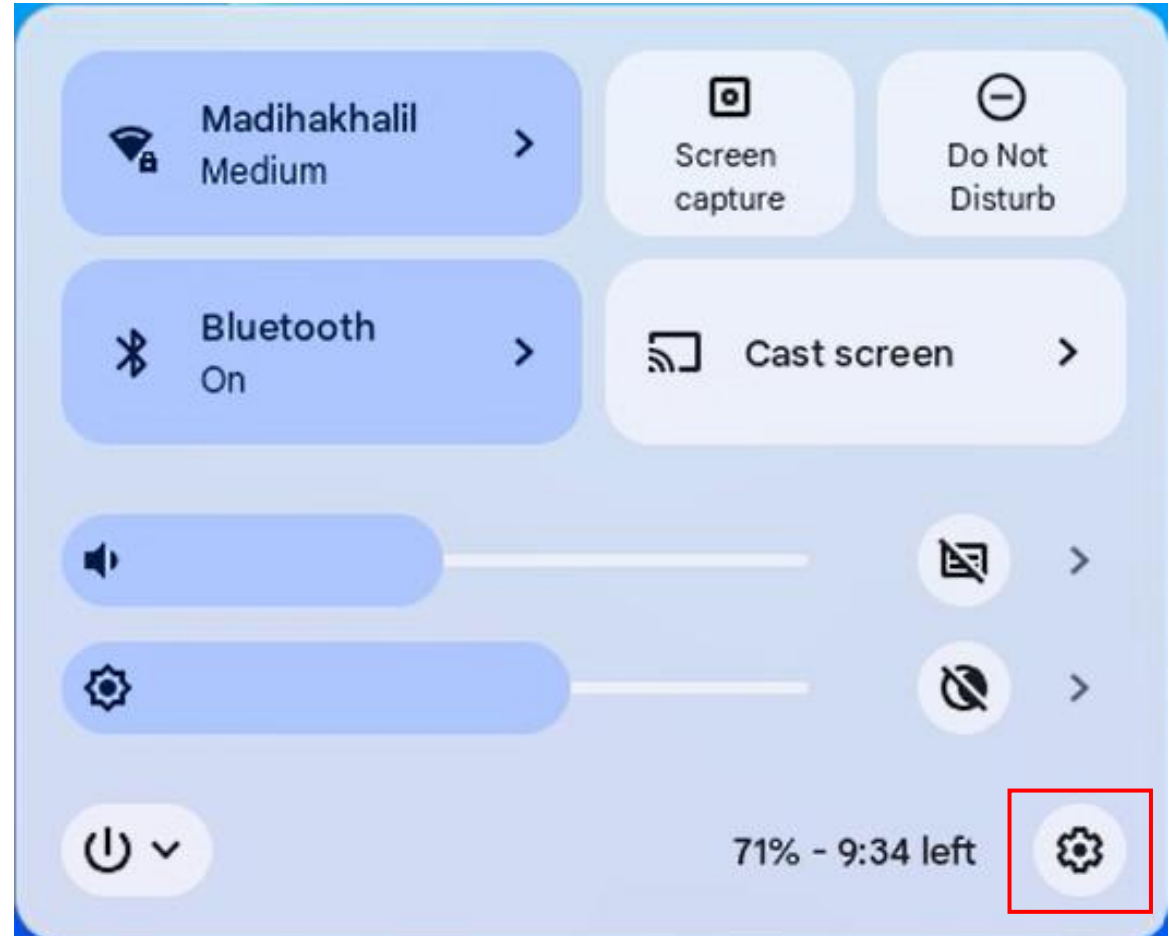
How to Connect to Bluetooth

- **Step 1:** Make sure the **Bluetooth device** you want to connect is on nearby and ready to pair.
- **Step 2:** Click on the **Quick Settings Panel** at the bottom right of your screen.
- **Step 3:** Click **Bluetooth**.
- **Step 4:** Select your Bluetooth accessory.
- **Step 5:** Follow any additional instructions on

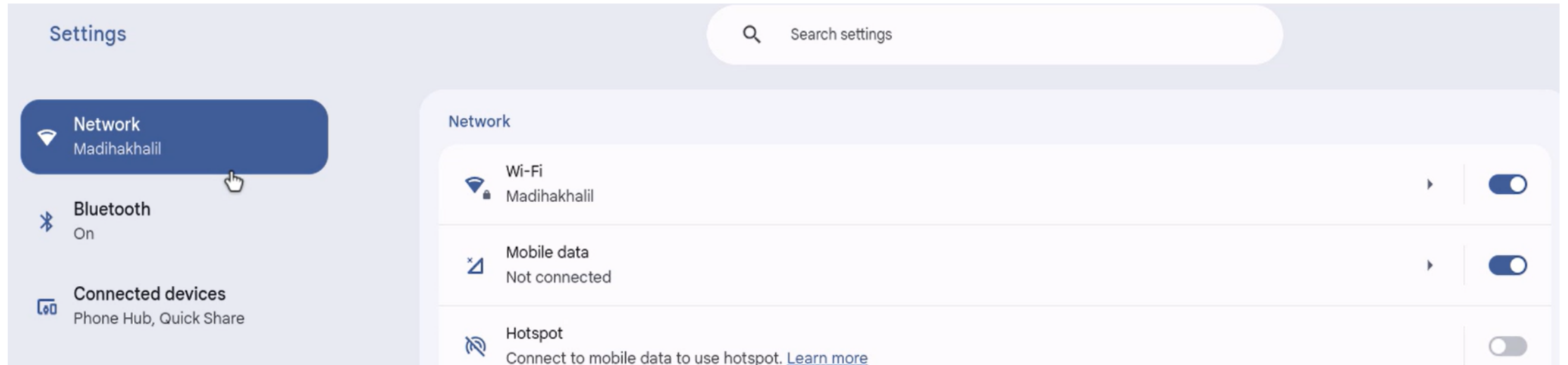

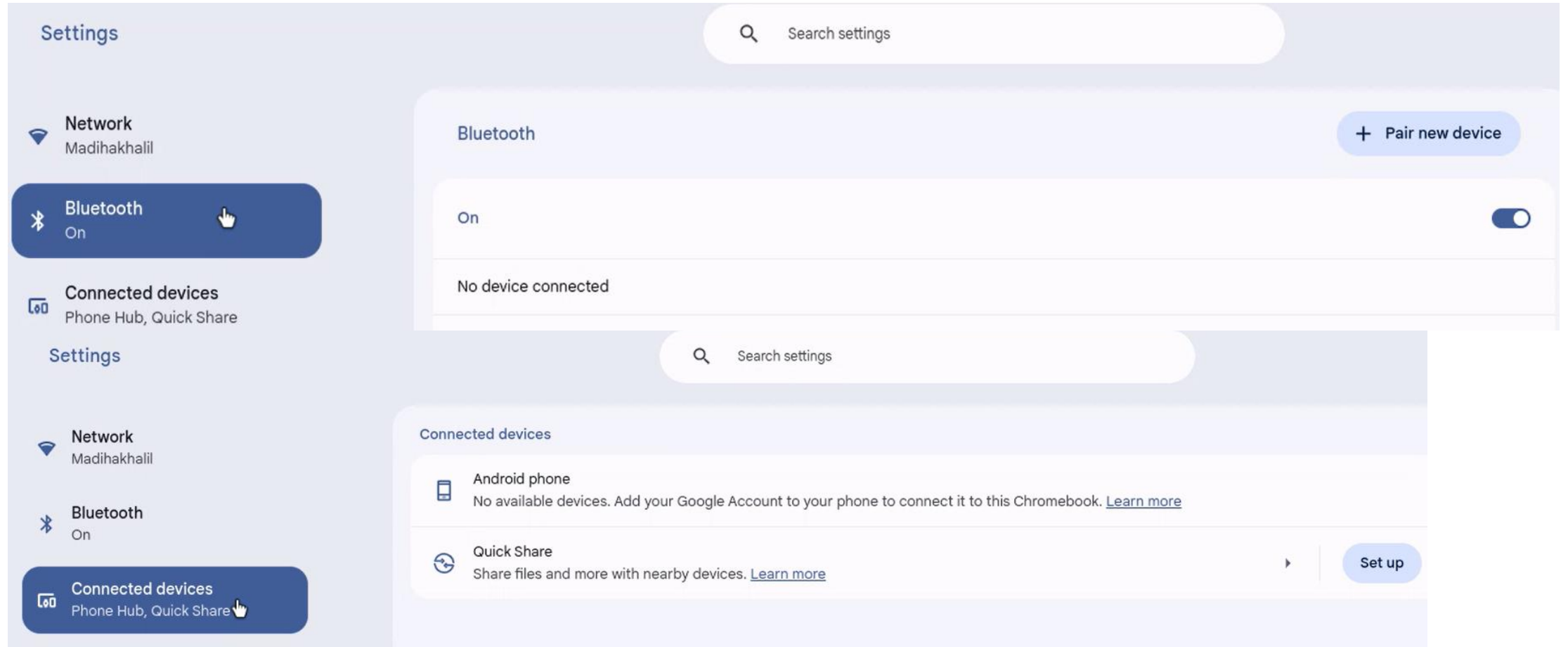

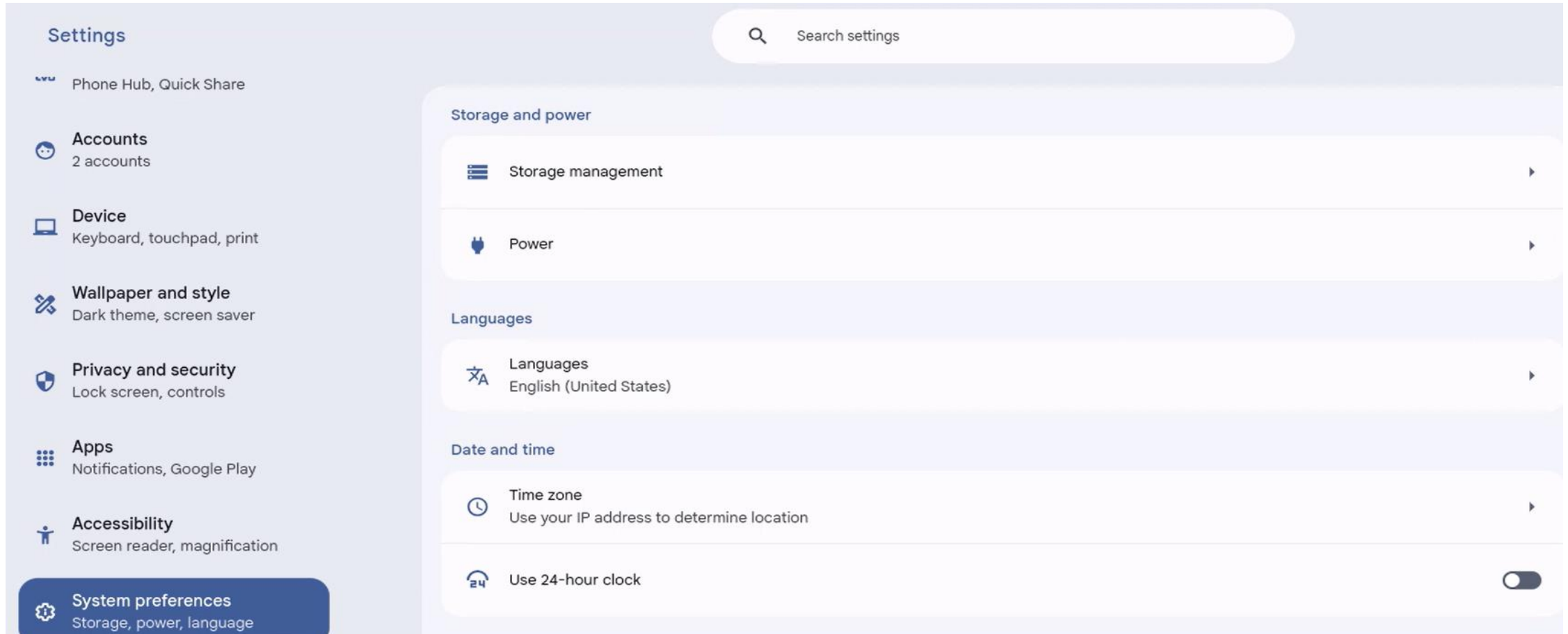

How to search anything on a Chromebook

- Step 1: Press **Search** and the **search bar** will appear.

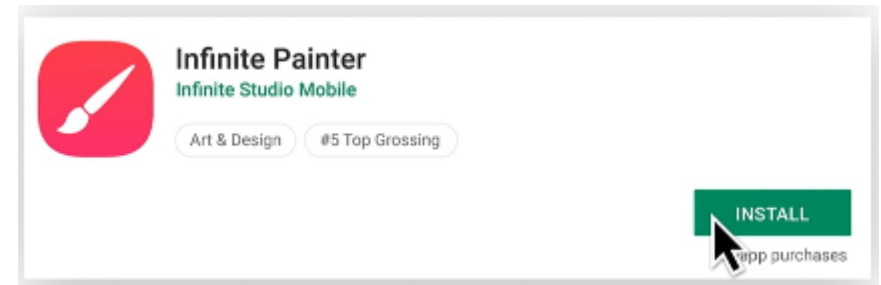
Step 2:

Now you can **search** files, apps, and the web.



Download Apps

- **Step 1:** Open the **Play Store** from the **Launcher** (○).
- **Step 2:** Browse apps by category there, or use the search box to find a specific app for your Chromebook.
- **Step 3:** After you've found an app, press the **Install** button on the app page.



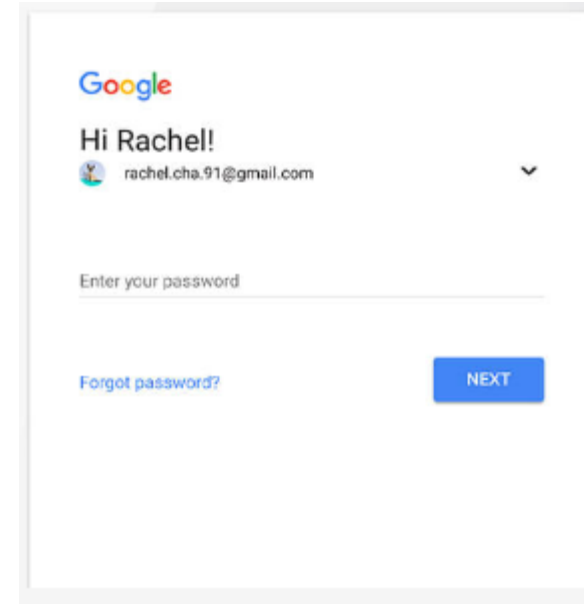
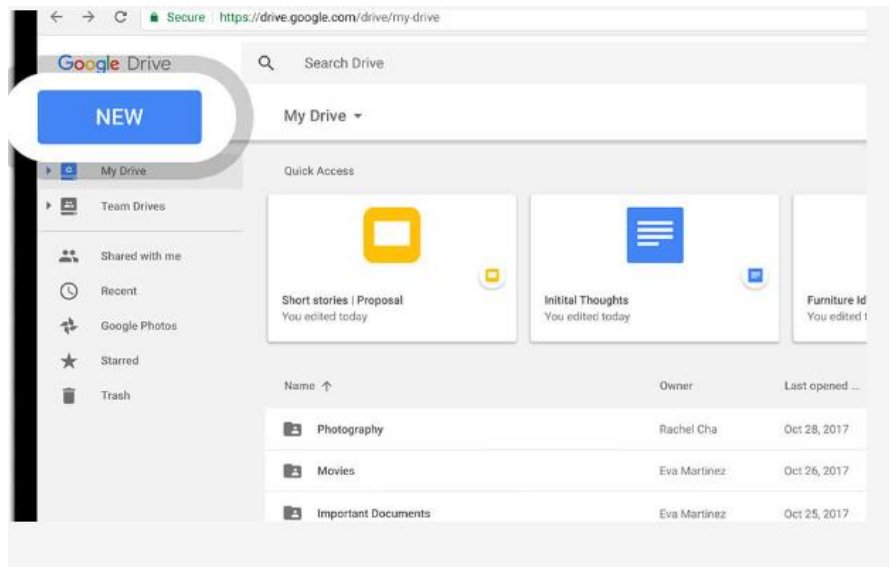
Download Apps (Continue)

- Step 4: The app will download and install to your Chromebook automatically.
- It will now appear in the **Launcher**.



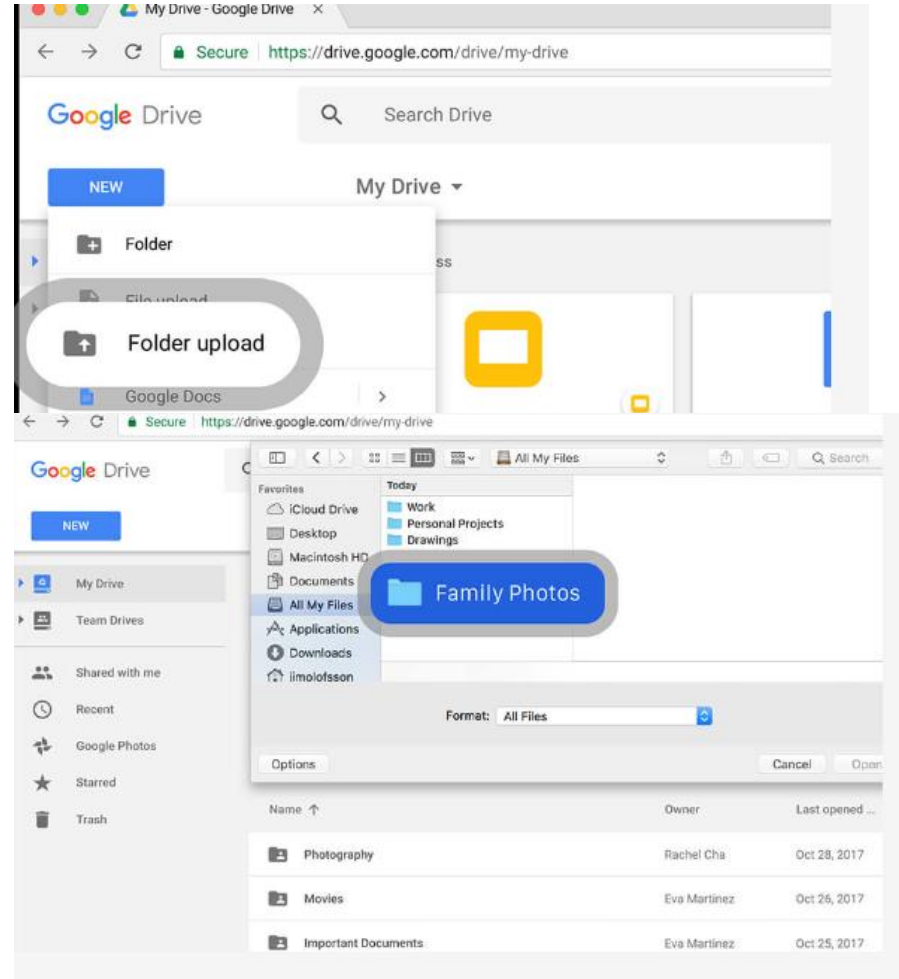
Transfer Files

- **Step 1:** On your PC or Mac go to [google.com/drive](https://drive.google.com/drive).
- **Step 2:** Log in with the same account you use on your Chromebook.
- **Step 3:** Click on the “New” button.





Transfer Files (Continue)




- **Step 4:** Then, select a format, like “Folder upload.”
- **Step 5:** Select all the files you want to upload.
- **Step 6:** Now log in to the **same account on your Chromebook** and all those files will be waiting for you.





Find and open a file

- **Step 1:** In the corner of your screen, select the Launcher .
- Open Files .
- On the left, choose where your file is saved.
 1. For files you've just used, select **Recent**.
 2. For a list of recent files by type, use the button to select that file type.

Delete a file

- In the corner of your screen, select the Launcher .
- Open Files .
- Select the file or folder you want to delete.
- Select **Trash** .
- **Important:** Most files are sent directly to Trash. For files that aren't sent to Trash, you must confirm that you want to permanently delete them.

Pin files to your shelf

- In the corner of your screen, select the Launcher .
- Open Files .
- On the left, select the folder that contains the file you want to pin.
- Right-click the file.
- Select **Pin to shelf**.
- To unpin files, right-click the file.
 - Select **Unpin from shelf**.

Pin files to your shelf (Continue)

- Find a pinned file:
 1. At the bottom right, select the **shelf container**.
 2. Right-click your file.
 3. Select **Show in folder**.

Open & edit Office files on your Chromebook

- On your Chromebook, you can open, edit, download, and save Microsoft® 365 files, such as Word, PowerPoint, or Excel files.
- **Option 1:** Use the Microsoft 365 app
- You can open Microsoft files stored on your Chromebook with the **Microsoft 365 app**, which contains Word, Powerpoint, and Excel.
- Option 2: Use Google Docs, Sheets, or Slides
- With **no setup needed**, Google apps on your computer can also open Microsoft 365 files.

Option 1: Use the Microsoft 365 app

- To set up Microsoft 365 on your computer:
- In the corner of your screen, select the Launcher .
- Find and select **Explore**.
- Navigate to "Microsoft 365".

Option 1: Use the Microsoft 365 app (Conti..)

- Select **Set up**.
- Follow the on-screen instructions and connect the Files app to Microsoft OneDrive.
- **OneDrive** is required to open and edit files in Microsoft 365.



Set up Microsoft 365 for your Chromebook

How it works:

1. Install Microsoft 365
2. Connect to Microsoft OneDrive
3. Files will move to OneDrive when opening in Microsoft 365

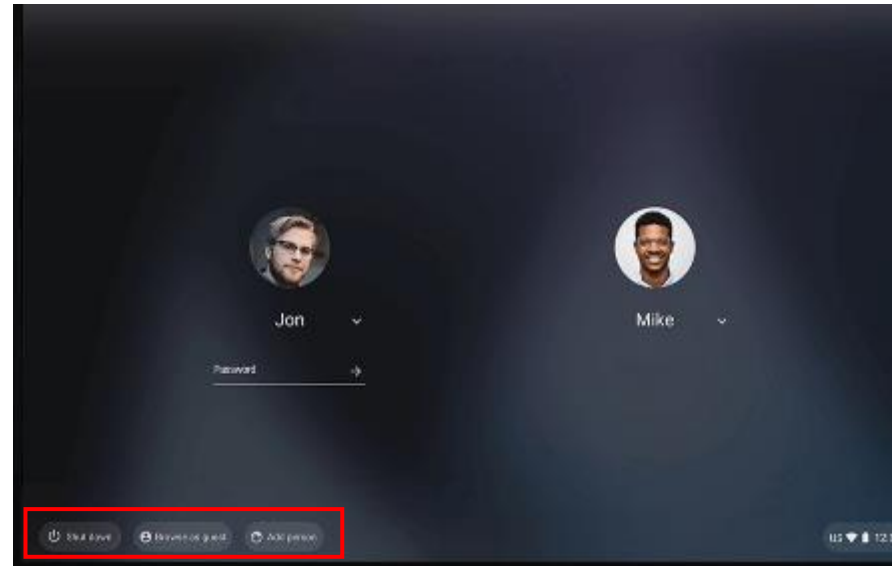
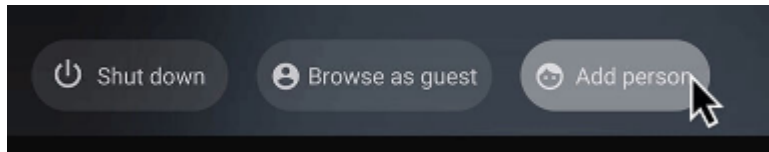
Option 1: Use the Microsoft 365 app (Conti..)

- **After you're set up:**

- Microsoft 365 app is added to **your Launcher**.
- Microsoft OneDrive appears in the Files app.
- Your file opens.

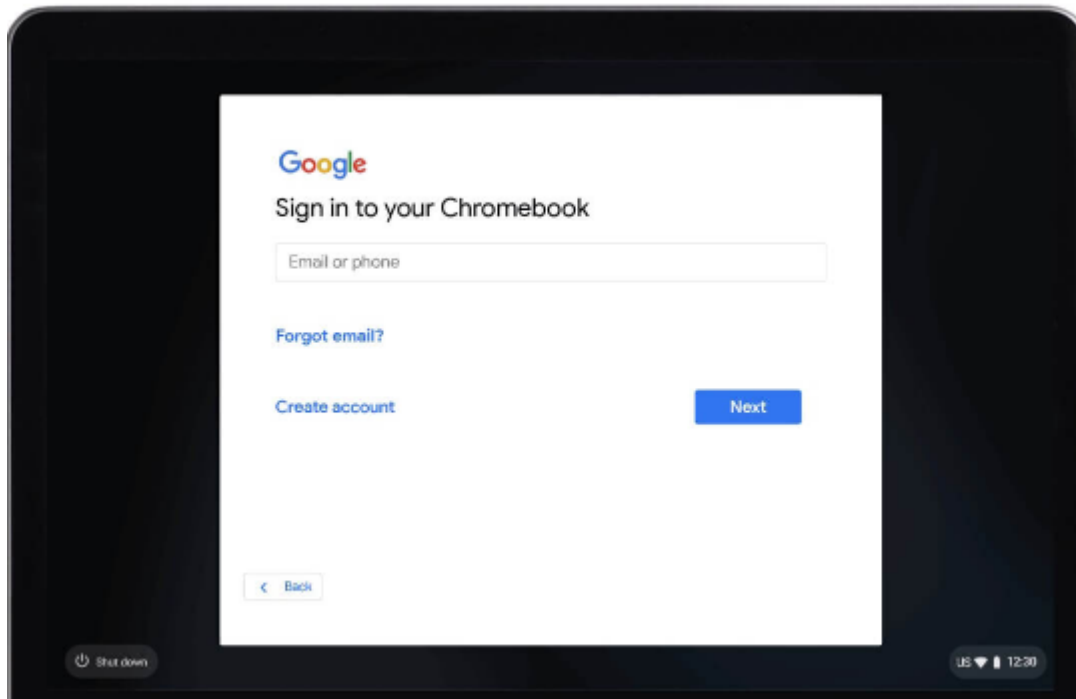
Add a New User Account

- **Step 1:** Start on the login screen.
- **Step 2:** Instead of logging in with your profile, click “**add person**” at the bottom of the screen.



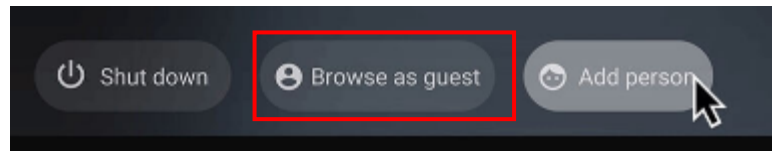
Add a New User Account

- **Step 3:** Then you can log in with any Google Account.

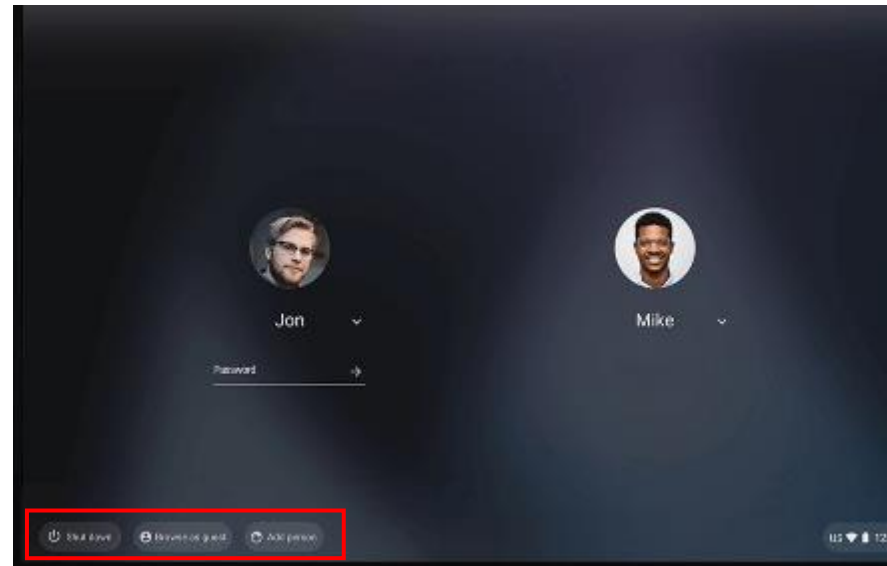


Browse as a Guest

- **Step 1:** Instead of logging in with your profile, click **Browse as Guest** at the bottom of the screen.



Step 2: Now you'll be able to use the Chromebook in **Guest mode**. You won't see any of the files saved in the other user accounts.



Step 3: When you're done, **log out**. **Your history or files won't be saved.**

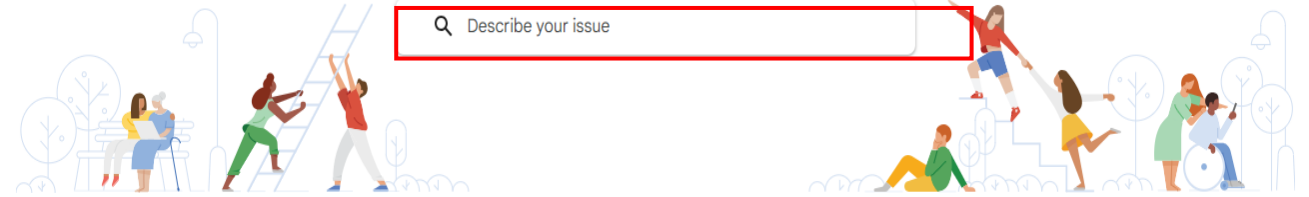

Chromebook Best Practices for Care and Use

- Always keep the Chromebook in a protective (if offered or provided).
 - For the highest level of protection, consider purchasing a protective Chromebook case.
- **Keep** the Chromebook dry, protected from rain, snow, and any other liquids.
- Take caution with food or drinks around the device.
- **Do not lean** on top of the Chromebook or place anything near the Chromebook that could put **pressure on the screen**
- Cords, cables, and removable storage devices must be **inserted carefully into the Chromebook.**

Chromebook Best Practices for Care and Use (Continue)

- Avoid touching the LCD screen with **sharp or pointed objects** (Example: Pencils, pens, and so forth).
- Do not leave your Chromebook in a car or any location that can expose the Chromebook to **extreme temperature** or direct sunlight for extended periods of time.
- Chromebooks should be shut down when **not in use** to conserve battery life.
- Close the Chromebook carefully from the top center of the LCD screen (**do not slam it shut**).

Chromebook Best Practices for Care and Use (Continue)

- **Do not stack** Chromebooks or other laptops when storing them or under other items that could put pressure on the Chromebooks.
- **Do not** place anything on the keyboard before closing the lid, such as pens, pencils, spiral notebooks, or as storage for loose papers.
- Do not rotate or open the LCD screen beyond its design limit.
- It is best **not** to place your Chromebook on uneven surfaces where it might accidentally fall.

Chromebook Best Practices for Care and Use (Continue)

- Do not pick up your Chromebook by the **LCD screen**.
- Avoid placing too many items around the Chromebook during transporting (laptop bag or backpack).
- Stuffing the Chromebook in your backpack with too many books around it could damage the LCD screen.

Clean your Chromebook often.

- **Shut down your Chromebook before cleaning.**
- **LCD Screen Cleaning:**
 - Gently wipe the LCD with a clean soft or microfiber cloth. Do not use window cleaner or any type of household cleaner on the LCD. Use a cleaner specially designed for an LCD.
- **Keyboard and Chassis Cleaning:**
 - Wipe surfaces lightly with a clean soft or microfiber cloth.
