- **Illustrated works:** works that consist entirely or largely of images or that include images that explain, augment, or embellish text or other content.
  - **Board books:** books with stiff board or plastic pages that are designed to stimulate early-literacy skills of babies and very young children.
  - **Picture books:** a book consisting mainly of visual content, with little or no text, intended mainly for children of preschool age
    - **Alphabet books:** books meant as primers for teaching the alphabet or those intended as vehicles for an illustrator's art
    - **Bath books:** a waterproof book for children that can be read in the bath
    - Wordless picture books: picture books without words
  - **Toy and movable books:** use for manipulative books, movable books, moveable books, novelty books, participation books, and slide-and-peek books
    - **Bath books:** a waterproof book for children that can be read in the bath
    - **Flip books:** books that consist of a series of illustrations bound together in a sequence so that they create an illusion of animation when flipped rapidly
    - **Glow-in-the-dark books:** works that glow in the dark, including those that glow only when activated by ultraviolet light.
    - **Lift-the-flap books:** books with one or more illustrated papers glued at one point; lifting a flap exposes the illustration directly beneath it
    - **Photicular books:** works that use a lenticular-based technology to transfer fluid four-color movies onto a book
    - **Pop-up books:** a book that contains one or more pages such that a three-dimensional structure rises up when a page is opened

- **Scented books:** use for fragrance books, perfumed books, scratchand-sniff books, smell books, and sniff books
- **Sound books:** interactive books have been enhanced through the use of technology, such as books with buttons that activate sound effects
- **Split-page books:** books with pages split into two or more sections to enable interactive mixing and matching of images
- **Textured books:** use for feel-and-touch books, texture books, texturized books, touch-and-feel books
- **Tunnel books:** works bound at both sides, with accordion-style pages that are viewed through an opening in the cover
- **Upside-down books:** books with pages that can be read in reverse; use for reversible books, turn-around books
- **Readers (Publications):** works containing material intended for instruction and practice in reading.
  - **High interest-low vocabulary books:** known as "hi-lo" books, these works combine engaging, age-appropriate content with texts written at a lower reading level to interest struggling readers
- Fiction genres
  - **Animal fiction:** fiction whose main characters are animals that may be anthropomorphized
  - **Bildungsromans:** fiction depicting the development of a character from youth to adulthood.
  - **School fiction:** fiction that is set in a school and focuses on the lives and interactions of students, teachers, and administrators
  - Sports fiction
  - **Stories in rhyme:** short fictional works written in rhymed text; novel-length fictional narratives expressed in poetry are entered under Novels in verse
- Children's sound recordings
  - Children's audiobooks
  - Children's radio programs: radio programs produced especially for children

- Motion picture genres
  - Children's films: films produced especially for children
  - **Teen films:** films produced especially for a teenage audience (i.e., the general age range of thirteen through eighteen years) and films with teenagers and teen issues as the primary subject
- Television program genres
  - **Children's television programs:** television programs produced especially for children
  - **Teen television programs:** use for fictional genre films and programs produced primarily for a teenaged audience
- Map and atlas genres
  - Children's atlases
  - Children's maps
