## Subject and Genre Headings for Juvenile Materials

**SHARE local practice -- delete children's subject headings if they're the same as the adult heading:**

Adult heading: 650 \_0 Dinosaurs \$v Juvenile fiction.

**Delete this** – Juvenile heading: 650 \_1 Dinosaurs \$v Fiction.

**Keep children's headings if they're different from the adult headings. Here are some examples:**

1. Adult heading: 650 \_0 Infants \$v Juvenile fiction.

Children's heading: 650 \_1 Babies \$v Fiction.

2. Adult heading: 650 \_0 Swine \$v Juvenile fiction.

Children's heading: 650 \_1 Pigs \$v Fiction.

3. Adult heading: 650 \_0 Treasure troves \$v Juvenile fiction.

Children's heading: 650 \_1 Buried treasure \$v Fiction.

4. Adult heading: 650 \_0 Imaginary companions \$v Juvenile literature.

Children's heading: 650 \_1 Imaginary playmates.

5. Adult heading 650 \_0 Enuresis \$v Juvenile literature.

Children's heading: 650 \_1 Bedwetting.

### Subdivisions:

Use "\$v Juvenile fiction" for fiction books. Use "\$v Juvenile literature" for non-fiction books. Use "\$v Juvenile films" for non-fiction kids' movies. Use "\$v Juvenile drama" for fiction kids' movies. Don't use "\$v Juvenile sound recordings" for audiobooks – use "Juvenile fiction" or "Juvenile literature" instead.

If using a term from the children's subject headings, make the second indicator "1" and remove the word "juvenile."

### Genre terms:

It's SHARE local practice to add **655 \_0 Young adult fiction.** to young adult fiction.

Add **655 \_7 Children's audiobooks. \$2 lcgft** to juvenile audiobooks.
