Subject and Genre Headings for Juvenile Materials

SHARE local practice -- delete children's subject headings if they're the same as the adult heading:

Adult heading: 650 _0 Dinosaurs \$v Juvenile fiction.

Delete this – Juvenile heading: 650 _1 Dinosaurs \$v Fiction.

Keep children's headings if they're different from the adult headings. Here are some examples:

1. Adult heading: 650 _0 Infants \$v Juvenile fiction.
Children's heading: 650 _1 Babies \$v Fiction.
2. Adult heading: 650 _0 Swine \$v Juvenile fiction.
Children's heading: 650 _1 Pigs \$v Fiction.
3. Adult heading: 650 _0 Treasure troves \$v Juvenile fiction.
Children's heading: 650 _1 Buried treasure \$v Fiction.
4. Adult heading: 650 _0 Imaginary companions \$v Juvenile literature.
Children's heading: 650 _1 Imaginary playmates.
5. Adult heading 650 _0 Enuresis \$v Juvenile literature.
Children's heading: 650 _1 Bedwetting.

Subdivisions:

Use "\$v Juvenile fiction" for fiction books. Use "\$v Juvenile literature" for non-fiction books. Use "\$v Juvenile films" for non-fiction kids' movies. Use "\$v Juvenile drama" for fiction kids' movies. Don't use "\$v Juvenile sound recordings" for audiobooks – use "Juvenile fiction" or "Juvenile literature" instead.

If using a term from the children's subject headings, make the second indicator "1" and remove the word "juvenile."

Genre terms:

It's SHARE local practice to add **655 _0 Young adult fiction.** to young adult fiction.

Add **655 _7 Children's audiobooks. \$2 lcgft** to juvenile audiobooks.
