



## SHALL WE PLAY A GAME?: CATALOGING GAMES

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CMC Cataloging Trainer Eric McKinney and Dr. Pamela Thomas, Bibliographic Grant Manager, discuss how to catalog video games, outdoor games, card games, and board games.

Good morning, everyone. Welcome to the first Online with the CMC of the new year! We are starting the new year off with games! Here is the agenda for today. We will define what we mean by "games." Then, we will look at the MARC fields we will need to pay attention to while cataloging games. We will finish out by looking at MARC records of various types of games. I will begin with video games and look at a couple of outdoor games. Pam will finish up with examples of card and board games.

## GAME DEFINITION

RDA defines objects as three-dimensional forms. Examples of objects within the scope of this guide include realia, toys, models, art originals, games, microscope slides, dioramas, and tactile three-dimensional forms.

Game (TMat=g)

•RDA: A resource designed for play according to prescribed or implicit rules and intended for recreation or instruction.

•BFAS: Items or sets of items designed for play according to prescribed rules and intended for recreation or instruction. Includes puzzles and simulations.

Game: A single physical item or set of materials designed for recreational or instructional play according to a prescribed or implicit set of rules (AACR2), usually stored in a container to keep the pieces together. The category includes puzzles and simulations. Games are usually stored in the curriculum room or children's room of a library (ODLIS).

The definition at the top of the slide, along with how to code the Type of Material, can be found in the On-line Audiovisual Catalogers (OLAC) Best Practices for Cataloging with the Original RDA Toolkit. BFAS is OCLC's Bibliographic Formats And Standards. The final definition of a game is from ODLIS (Online Dictionary for Library and Information Science). Both of these are hyperlinked on the Resources slide at the end of the presentation.

## MARC FIELDS TO TRANSCRIBE

The following data elements are the most common transcribed fields applicable to media.

- Title proper
- Parallel titles
- Variant titles (though non-transcribed variants are also permitted)
- Other title information
- Statement of responsibility
- Edition statement
- Place of publication (or production, distribution, manufacture)
- Publisher name (or production, distribution, manufacture)
- Date of publication (or production, distribution, manufacture)
- Series (for 490)
- Series number (for 490)

All other data elements should be recorded in the language and script of the cataloging agency. This includes notes, except for quoted notes.

The common fields in a MARC record for games that should be transcribed are listed on the slide. This information is taken from the OLAC Best Practices document and is hyperlinked on the Resources slide at the end of the presentation.

Let's begin by examining the records of a couple video games, looking at the fields used.

Our first video game is one of my favorites of 2025. Kingdom Come: Deliverance 2 (KCD2). Play as medieval knight Henry of Skalitz as he seeks justice against his half-brother Sigismund of Hungary. The game takes place in a detailed medieval Hungary that pays attention to historical accuracy. I will be looking at the Xbox Series X record of the game in OCLC, which is 1464711695.

I will start with fixed fields, and we will work our way down from there. As you can see, this record is created using the Computer Files template. For that reason, we have a Type of M, for computer files. BLvl is m as the item is a monograph/item. A Description of i indicates the record will be using ISBD punctuation. ELvl was cheerfully ignored. The Form of the item is q for Direct Electronic. BFAS defines direct electronic as: Storage on a directly accessible tangible recording medium, e.g. disc, tape, Playaway device, flash drive, portable hard drive, etc. BFAS also instructs us to not use code q for items that do not require the use of a computer (e.g., music compact discs and videodiscs).

Source is d for Other since the record was created by an organization other than a national bibliographic agency or a participant in a cooperative cataloging program. GPub is blank since the game is not a government publication. Audience is e for adult, which is appropriate considering the game rating and warnings. DtSt is set to t and we

provide both a publication date and a copyright date. We will see how this will affect the 2XX fields in a minute. Finally, we have the language set to English since that is the primary language. The country is au for Austria, which is where the publisher is located.

Here you can see the 0XX fields for KCD2. We will start with the extensive 007. \$a, the category of material, is c for electronic resource. If you were able to attend August's Online with the CMC on cataloging electronic resources, you know that materials intended to be accessed by a computer are considered electronic resources. \$b is the specific material designation. Ours is set to o for optical since it is a disc. \$d is the color content. Because the video game is in color, \$d is c for multicolored. \$e records dimension information. g indicates 4 ¾ inches or 12 cm, which is the size of the typical CD, DVD, or video game. KCD2 includes sound, so \$f is coded a to indicate such. \$g contains three dashes, indicating the bit depth of the content is unknown.

All other fields are coded with u for unknown. \$h is for the file format. \$i records whether quality assurance targets have been included. According to BFAS, quality assurance targets are standard reference points which can be interpreted by a human or machine and used to measure resolution, color, faithfulness of representation to the original, etc. \$j is for listing the antecedent or source of the digital file. Did it come from the original, was it reproduced by microform or an electronic resource? That information is not known for our game. \$k records the level of compression. Is it uncompressed, lossless, lossy, mixed? See November's Online with the CMC on starting a digitization project for more information on compression levels. (Along with a lot of other great info!) Finally, \$l is for recording reformatting quality. Is the resource

for access only? Preservation or replacement?

The 019 we will not worry about as it is OCLC-defined. BFAS notes it is technically not included in MARC 21 Format for Bibliographic Data.

A 024 with a first indicator of 1 is used to record the UPC number. There are several 028 fields recording the various publisher numbers found on the container and disc. A first indicator of 5 means other publisher number. A second indicator of 1 is used to make \$a an access point. That way, patrons can search for the item by the publisher number in the OPAC and find it.

Many of today's mainstream video games can be played in one of several different languages to reach as wide an audience as possible. \$a indicates the language the game can be played in. \$j are the languages the text of the game can be displayed in. Note that each language requires its own \$a or \$j.

We wrap up the 0XXs with an 082. The entry here may vary depending on the library's classification rules.

On to our 2XXs! The title statement is in 245. The subtitle is in \$b, and the developer is credited in \$c, the statement of responsibility. Several 246s are included, anticipating other ways the game might be searched for in the OPAC. The edition statement is in the 250, noting this game is for the Xbox Series S and Xbox Series X systems. The 2XXs are finished out with a pair of 264s. Because we used t in DtSt, we have the implied copyright date in the first 264 \$c. The second 264 contains the publication date in \$c.

The 300 has the physical description of our game. It contains 2 discs, has sound and color, and the dimensions are 4 ¾ in. Some of this might sound familiar from 007.

The mode of issuance in the 334 is single unit since the game circulates as a whole. There are two 336s containing the rdacontent. One noting the game is a computer program, and another noting it contains two-dimensional moving images. The 337 media type is computer, and the content carrier in the 338 is computer disc.

The 34Xs record the technical information of the game. The 340s note the dimensions in \$b and color content in \$g. \$I indicates the game has sound. The 347 notes the encoding format of 4K Ultra HD. Lastly, a 380, or form of work, has been added. It is using the LCSH term of video games.

Our 5XXs kick off with a pair of general notes in 500s. The first quotes a container blurb, the second notes that the game is intended for a single player. There is a short summary of the game taken from the container in an appropriate 520. Since 1994, video games have come with a rating from the Entertainment Software Rating Board. We can record that information in a 521, the target audience note. As you can see from the description, the game is quite spicy. The rating of mature is well-earned.

The 538 is the systems details note, i. e., what is needed to play the game. This is the Xbox version that can be played on the Xbox Series S or Xbox Series X console, but has been optimized for the series X. It can run in 4K Ultra HD.

This being a historical fiction game, there are historical figures in the game. You can see the 600 field for the Holy Roman Emperor Sigismund. Knights and knighthood, civil war, revenge, Renaissance, and Middle Ages are all used as subject headings. All have a form heading in \$v of video games.

We are not going to worry about the first three subject headings. Those are French headings added by OCLC. There are 2 650s with a second indicator of 0. These are subject/form terms using LCSH. There is also a 655 genre/form term with a 2<sup>nd</sup> indicator of 7 with the term video games taken from the LCGFT list.

The next terms are video game specific. Note that \$2 lists olacvggt which stands for OLAC Video Games Genre Terms. There is a link to a .pdf of the complete term list on the Resources slide. It is noted that it is a closed list, with no plans of adding new terms. Vgmsgg are terms taken from the Open Metadata Registry's Video Game Metadata Schema. There is a link to the Open Metadata Registry on the Resources page as well. The record ends with 710s, noting the publishers and developer. Finally, a 753 system details access to computer files, again noting that an Xbox is required to play this version of the game.

Our next video game is the cult hit Disco Elysium, based on the tabletop role-playing game. This is the PC version. Our fixed fields are not going to differ greatly from KCD2. The key difference I would like to point out is the Form field. Unlike KCD2, the form here is o for online, since the game is not accessed via disc.

Let's run through the 007. Again, \$a is c for electronic resource. This time, \$b is coded r for remote, as that is how the content is accessed. The game is in color so \$d is coded c to indicate such. \$e is coded n for not applicable since it is not a physical game and has no dimensions. The game has sound, so \$f is a. Again, \$g is --- because the bit depth is not known. \$h records the number of file formats. Our game only has one, so \$h is coded a for single file format. There are no quality assurance targets present so \$i is a for absent. \$j is n for not applicable since it is only used when the item is the result of reformatting. The level of compression in \$k indicates the item is uncompressed. \$l records the reformatting quality. Since we know our item is not the result of reformatting, it is coded n for not applicable.

The record does not include 02Xs. With no physical packaging, UPCs, publisher numbers, etc., are often not present.

There is an 041, language code, noting the game can be played in English or Chinese. When a 041 is present in a record, we should expect a 546 where the codes are spelled out. We will see that in a minute.

Here you can see the 2XXs and 3XXs. The title is in 245 \$a with the developer in \$c. Developed by is bracketed as that is not actually present on the GOG Disco Elysium title screen.

The edition statement is also bracketed. Again, the title screen does not expressly say that it is the GOG edition, but this manifestation of the game can only be accessed through GOG's gaming platform.

The GOG title screen does not list the location of the publisher, but a quick internet search shows ZA/UM is in London. Like KCD2, there are 2 264 c's with the copyright/publication date recorded.

The 300 shows our game is an online resource with sound and color. There are 2 336 fields. One with two-dimensional moving image with a \$b of tdi and \$2 of rdacontent. The second 336 is computer program with a \$b of cop and the same \$2 as the first, rdacontent. The 337 is computer in \$a, c in \$b, and rdamedia is in \$2. The 338 is online resource in \$a, cr in \$b, and rdacarrier in \$2.

Note the lack of 347s or digital file characteristics. The characteristics normally recorded here, file type, encoding type, file size, resolution, and encoding are not

known for this online version.

Finally, a 380 or form of work, of video games has been added.

And here we are at the 5XXs. There is a general note in the 500 stating the game is for a single player. The 508 lists the developer in the creation/production credits note. The summary in the 520 is a bit long, but I left it as is. The game does have a rating of T for teen and above, so a 521 has been added. The first indicator of 8 means no display content generated. The display content of reading grade level, interest grade level, special audience characteristics, and motivation/interest level do not apply.

The 538 is the system requirements needed to access the game. A PC or laptop with an internet connection and web browser are needed to access the game.

And here is the 546 spelling out the codes used in the 041.

Finally, the source of description note states the title was taken from the publisher's resource page for the game.

We will wrap up the video games with the 6XX/7XX fields. You can see the LC subject headings. Again, I would like to point out the olacvggt terms added. Detective and mystery video games, Fantasy video games, and Role playing video games. A genre/form term of video games is also present in a 655 with a second indicator of 7. Lastly, a 710, corporate name added entry, with the developer's name is present. Note that RDA requires the use of relator terms in the 710. Developer and publisher have been used here.

Pickleball has become super-popular recently. If you are not familiar with pickleball, it is a tennis-like game that also borrows from table tennis. It has its own scoring system, paddles, and balls. Pickleball was invented in 1965 by the future lieutenant governor of Washington state, Joel Pritchard, and a couple of his friends. Pickleball became the official state sport of Washington in 2022.

So, let us look at a record for a portable pickleball net. The A11N pickleball net is OCLC number 1341225496. We will start with the fixed fields.

The record was created using the Visual Materials template. The Type is r for three-dimensional artifact or naturally occurring object. BLvl is m for monograph/item. And RDA requires ISBD punctuation, so Desc is i, as we have seen in the other records. Elvl and Form are left blank. TMat equals g for game. The technique is not applicable; the audience is coded for general. There is no time associated with the item. The date is questionable, but probably somewhere between 2012 and 2022. The language associated with the item is English, and it was made in Kansas.

Here are the 0XX-2XXs for the net. Note the absence of a 007. There is a 007 for tactile material, but most of the options there are braille-related. The 007 for unspecified might be an option, but the options of unspecified or other do not add a lot of information, so I chose not to add it.

040 \$e indicates the record is cataloged using RDA.

There is a DDC number in 082. There is no main entry, so there are no 1XXs. The 245 is in place. We will look at where the title came from later in the record. There are a pair of 246s listing the alternate terms that might be used to find the item. The place of publication was taken from somewhere other than the item itself. The publisher is A11N sports and the questionable dates are bracketed.

300 \$a notes it is 1 pickleball net. \$b has the characteristics of the item, and it's carrying bag. A good rule of thumb for 300 \$b: if it is present, the elements listed should have a corresponding 34X. The 300 ends with \$e, c and e noting the dimensions of both the net and the bag.

The 334, or mode of issuance, is single unit. Although the item consists of more than one item, it is circulated as a single unit.

336 is three-dimensional form, the 337 is unmediated, and the 338 is object. The 340s are where we want to start listing the information from 300 \$b. As you can see, each begins with a \$3, which lets us describe which material applies to which characteristic. The bag and net are textile materials, while the frame is made of plastic and metal. The terms are taken from the RDA Registry.

We will finish up our pickleballin' with the 5XX and 6XXs. There is a general note with the weight of the net. That is a fairly hefty net! A summary notes it is, well, a portable pickleball net. I mentioned earlier that we would see how the title was derived. The source of description note in the 588 says the cataloger produced it. Pickleball is popular enough that it does have its own subject headings in the Library of Congress, CAQQLA, and fast. The record ends with a form/genre term of puzzles and games.

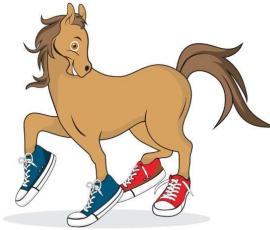

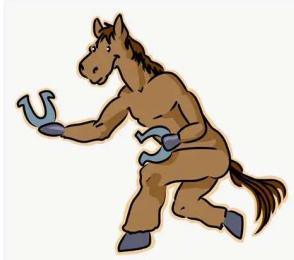

I will wrap up my portion of the presentation with the 6XX/7XXs. Again, there are LC, CAAQLA, and fast headings in place. It has the same 655 as the pickleball net. I must admit, I was not familiar with the term quoits. But checking the authority record revealed it is certainly a good fit. You can see it on the right of the slide. Anyone up for a game of quoits?

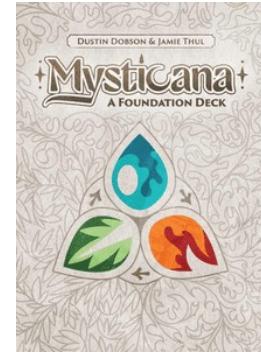

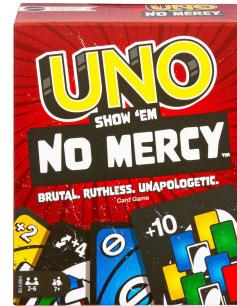

This is the same record in Connexion. This is OCLC #29352503. Typically, board games do not have an author, but Set : the family game of visual perception does. However, perhaps the relator term in subfield e should be changed to creator. Notice that this is catalogued as Visual Materials. Starting with the fixed fields, Type, Type of Record, is coded r for Three-dimensional artifact or naturally occurring object. BLvl, Bibliographic Level, is coded as m for Monograph/Item (in this case, as an item). Desc, Descriptive Cataloging Form, is coded i for ISBD, meaning that ISBD punctuation is used in the bibliographic record. TMat, Type of Visual Material, is coded g, for Game, but you find this code under the subheading of Three-dimensional artifacts or naturally occurring objects. Srce, Cataloging Source, is coded d for other, so it was not catalogued by a National bibliographic agency, Cooperative cataloging program, or an unknown agency. Tech, Technique, is coded as n for not applicable. Time, Running Time, is coded nnn, for not applicable. DtSt, Type of Date/Publication Status, is coded t for Publication Date and Copyright Date. Dates, Date 1 & 2 both have 1991. Date 1 is the publication date, and Date 2 is the copyright date. Lang, Language Code, is coded eng for English. *Lang* represents the language of the item. Ctry, Country of Publication, etc., is coded azu, the three-digit code for Arizona. This must match what is in 264 \$a. The 007 field, Physical Description Fixed Field, for the category of material for a game is unspecified. Use field 007 to code data related to the physical characteristics of resources. The data coded in

field 007 may refer to the resource as a whole, to parts of the resource including accompanying material, or to additional physical characteristics applicable to the resource. The physical characteristics are often related to information in other parts of the MARC record, including [field 300](#), fields [33X and 34X](#), and some of the [5XX](#) note fields. Subfield a coded as z is for unspecified, and subfield b coded as z is other. For the second 007 field, subfield a as z is for unspecified and subfield b coded as u is for unspecified. In this record, the first 007 field is for the game itself, and the second 007 field is for the container. I'm just going to point out some of the more unique variable fields. The 041 field, Language Code, has 1 as a first indicator, Item is or includes a translation. Subfield g is for Language code of accompanying material other than librettos and transcripts. The 246 3\_, Varying Form of Title, and the first indicator of 3 is for No note, added entry, has the subtitle, Family game of visual perception. The 246 30, Varying Form of Title, with a first indicator of 3, No note, added entry, and a second indicator of 0, Portion of title, has Visual perception.

This is the rest of the MARC record for Set: the family game of visual perception. The 300 field, Physical Description, has 1 game (2 sets of cards) in subfield a, extent. Subfield c, dimensions, has the dimensions of the case, and subfield e, accompanying material, has instruction booklet. When the 300 field ends in subfield e, the field does not end in a period. The 337 field, Media Type, has a field for the game with subfield a unmediated, and the second 337 field, subfield a unspecified, for the container. The 338 field, Carrier Type, has the first field for the game with object in subfield a, and the second 338 field with unspecified in subfield a for the container. The 340 field, \$g, has polychrome, reflecting 300 \$b. There is a 500, General Note, informing us that the instructions are in English, French, and Spanish. The 520 field, Summary, Etc. note, gives a summary statement. There are Library of Congress Subject headings in the 650 fields of Visual perception and Problem solving. There is one Library of Congress Genre/Form term in the 655 field, Educational games.

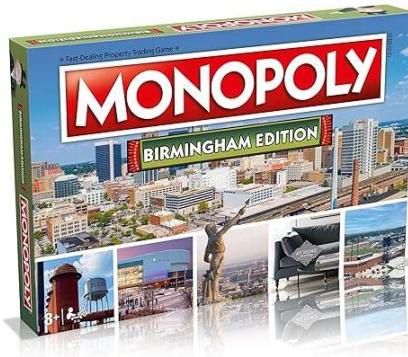

Srce, Cataloging Source, is coded d for other, so it was not cataloged by a National bibliographic agency, Cooperative cataloging program, or an unknown agency. Tech, Technique, is coded as n for not applicable. Audn, Audience, is coded g for General. Time, Running Time, is coded nnn, for not applicable. DtSt, Type of Date/Publication Status, is coded t for Publication Date and Copyright Date. Dates, Date 1 & 2 are 2024, 2024. Date 1 is the publication date, and Date 2 is the copyright date. Lang, Language Code, is coded eng for English. Lang represents the language of the item. Ctry, Country of Publication, etc., is coded riu, the three-digit code for Rhode Island, United States. This must match what is in 264 \$a. I'm just going to point out some of the more unique variable fields. The 024 1#, Other Standard Identifier—Universal Product

Code, 885996006409. The 043 field, Geographic Area Code, is coded for Alabama. This must match a 6XX field. The 245 00, Title Statement, has Monopoly as the title and Birmingham edition as the remainder of the title. The 250, Edition Statement, also has Birmingham edition. There are three 264 fields: Production, Publication, Distribution, Manufacture, and Copyright Notice. The first 264 has publication information. The second 264 field has distribution information. The third 264 field has copyright information. In the 300 field, Physical Description, has 1 game (1 game board, 8 character tokens, 28 title deed cards, 16 chance cards, 16 community chance cards, 1 pack of Monopoly money, 32 houses, 12 hotels, 2 dice, and instructions) in subfield a, extent. Subfield b, Other physical details, has cardboard, metal, paper, plastic, color. Subfield c, dimensions, has the dimensions of the container, 27 x 41 x 6 cm. The 334 field, Mode of Issuance, has single unit in subfield a, Mode of Issuance Term, and in subfield 2, Source of term, has rdami, the code for RDA Mode of Issuance. Let's look at more of the MARC record on the next slide.

There are three 336 fields, Content Type: three-dimensional form, still image (for images on the board and cards), and text, for text on the board and cards. The 337 field, Media Type, has a field for the game with subfield a, unmediated. The 338 field, Carrier Type, has the first field for the cards with card and the second 338 for the game with object in subfield a. The 340 fields reflect the material base of materials of the items and align with the terms found in 300 \$b. The 588 0# field, Source of Description Note—Source of Description, has Title from container, informing us that the cataloger found the title on the container. There are three 500 fields, General Note, informing us that this is a fast-dealing property trading game, a note with some sort of numbering code, and a note that this game is for 2-6 players. The 520 field, Summary, Etc. note gives a summary note and documents that this information was found on the container, in subfield c, Assigning source. The 521 field, Target Audience Note, tells us that this game is suitable for Ages 8 and older. There is a Library of Congress subject heading, Monopoly (Game) \$v Miscellanea.

There are two 710 2# fields, Added Entry—Corporate Name—Name in direct order, Hasbro, Inc., with a relator term, licensor, and Top Trumps USA, Inc., with relator terms, manufacturer and distributor.

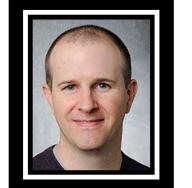
